She served as a consultant to the US Congress's House Education and Labor Committee on discrimination resulting from fetal protection policies. She is currently at work on a book entitled *Gender and Judging*. Beginning January 1, 2010, she will be the Executive Director of the H. Sophie Newcomb Memorial College Institute at Tulane University where she will hold the Newcomb College Endowed Chair.
